\$150.00 per parcel per year on all other parcels; For the purposes of this ordinance, all contiguous lots under common ownership shall be considered a single parcel. The ordinance will not take effect unless and until it is approved by two-

thirds of the voters voting upon such proposition at the election of Tuesday

November 2, 1982.
The meeting was then open for public expression and feed-back. Questions on why the Community Center can't be self-supporting? Why the Child Care Program rental being so low? the electric bills? were answered by Board members. Carles Felix offered to buy the small parcel of property including the shack because of it being a "bloody eyesore" fronting his Inn and the tresspassing on his land because of the shack. He suggested this could eleminate the need on his land because of the shack. He suggested this could eleminate the need for the special taxes. He would put it to an appropriate use for storage purposes. A sum of \$12,000.00 was mentioned as the purchase price by Felix. Public hearing closed at 8:52P.M. A. Collier moved, seconded by Myers the Board pass the Resolution drawn up by the County Counsel's office proposing the special tax ordinance # 782 for the district. Ayes were unanimous.

C. Election of new CSD chairperson for next 6 months: Freebairn-Smith then immediately moved to re-elect Burke for another six months, seconded by

OLD BUSINESS:

A. Burke gave a status report on rennovation and replacement of primary well and pump. Weeks Drilling & Pump Co. had been called and attempted to clear and clean both wells and pumps using chemicals; the primary pump is still in trouble, perorated casing could not be cleared. Request for bidders and proposal was placed in the legal notices section of the Independent— Journal 7/10,12,13. If bidding is successful, work will continue to restore primary pump and drilling of a new well on July 19. It is estimated that all work can be completed in one week. Pressure, yield, and satisfactory chemical & bacterial analysis will be done by County Dept. of Public Health while work is being done in new well.

B. Pacific Way Slide: Pickens reported there are hazardous condition signs &

cones placed along edge of road slide. C. Felix's proposal of purchase of shack & property: The issue was opened for discussion by Nelson. He suggested a lease option be offered Felix. It was decided to have further study and talks with Felix and bring back to the

Board the results to be put on next month's agenda.

## ORDINANCE NO. 7-82

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE MUIR BEACH COMMUNITY SERVICES DISTRICT IMPOSING A SPECIAL TAX IN THE DISTRICT

THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS of the Muir Beach Community Services District does hereby ordain as follows:

SECTION I. Pursuant to the provisions of Article 3.5 of Chapter 1, Part 1, Division 1, Title V, of the California Government Code and Article XIIIA of the California Constitution this Board of Directors hereby imposes special taxes on the property within the Muir Beach Community Services District for the purposes for which said District is organized.

SECTION II. The amount of and type of said special tax shall not exceed the following rates:

- \$1,000.00 per parcel per year on commercially zoned and improved property;
- 2. \$150.00 per separate habitable structure per year on parcels containing residential improvements;
- 3. \$150.00 per parcel per year on all other parcels;
- 4. For the purposes of this ordinance, all contiguous lots under common ownership shall be considered a single parcel.

SECTION III. Pursuant to the provisions of ARTICLE XIIIB of the California Constitution, the appropriations limit of the Muir Beach Community Services District is hereby increased by an amount equal to the special taxes imposed by this ordinance for a period of four (4) years.

SECTION VI. Said special taxes shall be collected in the same manner and subject to the same penalties as and with other charges and taxes fixed and collected by the County on

behalf of local agencies. The County Auditor may deduct the reasonable costs incurred by the County for this service before remittance of the balance to the local agency.

INDEPENDENT-JOURNAL , a newspaper of general circulation published within Marin County, not later than fifteen (15) days after its adoption, but shall not take effect unless and until it is approved by two-thirds of the voters voting upon such proposition at an election to be held on Tuesday, November 2, 1982.

Manager Pickens reported the pump and well project has not been completed. They are waiting for a 250 lb. valve part to arrive. A good well had been dug in the middle of picnic grounds and he is satisfied with the work done so far. We are doing fine in the water department and the quality is good. The Board commended Pickens for all his work done on the project. B. Recreation Report; Burke reported for Nelson due to his being absent. Permit for playing field has been granted by GGNRA(for corner of Franks Valley Road and Highway One). Decision will be made by the Board at the September 15th meeting. Discussion and input are requested from community at this meeting in order that whether or not the Board accepts the permit.

ARGUMENT FOR AND AGAINST MEASURE "M": Collier reported on the argument for the measure to be voted on by the voters of the district in the 11-2 election. Of all the alternatives considered in the Board's public hearings it provides the most equitable means of reising the much model finds it provides the most equitable means of raising the much needed funds since it taxes all non-commercial properties, at a cost to each property owner of only \$12.50 per month. If the proposed measure fails, water rates will have to be increased \$25.00 per month to raise the same needed funds, due to many properties not paying water bills. The argument for Measure M was signed by Directors Myers, Burke, Collier, and Freebairn-Smith (Nelson being absent) and Sward, Fire Chief

An argument against Measure M was received. They challenge the proposed ordinance because of it's ambiguity and redundancy. They feel the need to require an election for the assessment district at least every two years and not for a period of four years. Involvement of Seacape property owners should be explicitly defined, in view of their increasing financial contribution to the district. Signed by Hester Burn-Callander, Russ Compton, and Ann Balbour-Griffin.

The Board of Directors decided not to write a rebuttal.

NEW BUSINESS:

A. PRESENTATION AND CONSIDERATION OF 1982-83 fiscal budget:
The Directors adopted a \$63,349 budget for 1982-83. The budget includes a 7 per cent across the board pay increase for salaries.
B.CONSIDERATION OF WATER BILL COLLECTION SYSTEM AND CUT-OFF TIME SCHEDULE

AND DELINQUENCIES:

After a lengthy discussion the collection procedures are being changed to be more in line with other utilities, effective with the August/September billing periods. Fortunately most of our consumers pay their water bills in a timely manner, however, some bills are outstanding far too long. The new

water bill collection procedures are as follows:

1. Your water bills will be delinquent if not paid within thirty (30) days of the billing date shown on the bill. (See "NOTICE" on your bill too).

- 2. If your account becomes delinquent a second notice will be part of the next month's bill (30 days later) notifying the customer that if balance due is not paid within fifteen (15) days, the water service will be discontinued after that 15 days (45 days from the first bill) and users will be notified the service will be turned off in 48 hours.
- If you have any questions or wish to make arrangements for paying the bill call Hazel Melo-388-1313.

Collier moved, seconded by Myers to adopt the new collection procedures. Ayes: Burke, Collier, Myers. Abstaining: Freebairn-Smith. Absent: Nelson C. BARBECUE AREA USE AND FEES FOR USE: Discussion on if the District should charge a flat fee for the use of the

barbecue area for non-residents. No action was taken.

D. COMMUNITY CENTER USE AND FEES FOR USE:
The Committee will discuss this matter at their next meeting.
E. FELIX/HAVSTAD COASTAL COMMISSION & PLANNING DEPT. PERMITS:
Burke reported on the two letters she had sent to Neil Sorenson, Planner, regarding the application expressing our concerns. The Board endorsed the letters. Freebairn-Smith moved, seconded by Collier another letter be sent requesting a full environmental impact report be requested for the proposed development. Ayes were unanimous. More on this at the next meeting. Discussion followed re: the shed on CSD property adjoining the Pelican Inn. Myers moved that the CSD will either raze the shed or move the structure down to the picnic area. An advisory letter to be sent Felix. Seconded by Collier. Ayes were unanimous. OLD BUSINESS:

A. PUMP AND WELL RESTORATION UP-DATE: Burke reported FEMA will pay 75% of the actual costs, with the San Francisco Foundation picking up the remaining 25%. FEMA and the San Francisco Foundation have also granted \$2,426 to road repair and with the \$3,188 already received for picnic tables replacement which will be converted into road money, giving the District a total \$5,614. The amount estimated to cover road repair being \$6,000 or more. B.LITTLE BEACH USE:

The Community and Sheriff Howenstein are to meet to further deal with the problem.

ANNOUCEMENTS:

Fire Chief Sward announced there will be a fire extinguisher refill and sale of smoke detectors some time in September at the fire house location. Details will be posted for date, time and costs. Also to be in the Beachcomber.
