Minutes – As attached: Draft Minutes from June 19, 2014 meeting. 27 28 MOTION: To approve item A as amended 29 Moved: Jeschke, seconded by Bender 30 **AYES: Unanimous** Vote: 31 32 NATIONAL PARK SERVICE REPORT Item 3 33 34 No National Park Service representatives were present to report. 35 36 Item 4 FIRE DEPARTMENT REPORT 37 38 Fire Chief Steve Wynn reported. The Fire Department is looking for new recruits. Propane tanks in the 39 community are being inspected for safety. Once the inspections are completed, owners will be notified if there are safety issues to be addressed. Currently, new service requires that tanks be mounted on a 40 41 slab, be securely anchored, and have an earthquake shut-off valve. 42 43 Barbara Piotter will be heading a Muir Beach disaster meeting at the Community Center on September 17 44 at 7:00 PM. She's drawn up a list of positions that would be helpful to have filled should a disaster take 45 place. 46 47 Fire Safety Day usually takes place in late October. If there is enough interest, the Fire Department will 48 provide training on fire extinguisher safety and use. Additionally, he would like to get the chimney sweep 49 program going again. 50 51 The upcoming winter could be dry and Steve is encouraging residents to assess what fuel sources exist 52 around their homes and work to clear a defensible space. 53 54 Caltrans was very responsive when recently asked to clear a swath on either side of Highway One.

Several other problem areas in Muir Beach were discussed.

Marin County Fire is providing six new fire hydrants for Sunset Way. Since nine are needed, he will see if they can also provide the remaining three.

Item 5 **DISTRICT MANAGER REPORT**

Water Main Replacement and Road Improvements – ILS Associates has been engaged to provide the necessary engineering work for the project to upgrade Sunset Way and Cove Lane - replacement of water main, drainage improvements, fire truck turnaround, and repaving. The first draft of engineering drawings should be available next week. Once the plans are available, the CSD will provide comments and meet with neighbors. The engineer will reserve an area in the road width for electrical to go underground at some future date. The work could possibly be completed this season, depending on the length of the bidding process and conclusion of the engineering work. Otherwise, it will take place next spring.

State Required Prohibition on Non-Essential Uses of Water - In July, the State Water Resources Control Board issued a mandate to water providers such as the CSD to implement mandatory restrictions prohibiting "non-essential" uses of water. Leighton reviewed the programs implemented by MMWD and North Marin Water District and has written a proposed resolution that is both a fit for Muir Beach and complies with the mandate.

As part of the CSD's obligations under its water rights permit we monitor flow conditions in the creek. The USGS operates several automated stream monitors in the County and is willing to contract with us to install and operate another for Redwood Creek. Cost would be \$7,500 per year for a minimum of three years. The NPS has offered to take half of that cost and the remaining \$3,750 to be paid by us. Without objection from the Board, the District Manager will make arrangements to proceed.

AGENDA ITEMS BY PAUL JESCHKE Item 6

Chipper Program - Paul researched the history of the chipper program, which began in 2001 with a grant of \$40K from the WUI funds and was initially operated by the Fire Association. Currently, the program is a risk our insurance carrier is not willing to accept. Various scenarios were discussed that might mitigate the insurance risk. Paul and Leighton will explore how other chipper programs are being operated and report back.

Size of Buses on Frank Valley Road - The problems with large buses operating on Frank Valley Road and Highway One continue. Paul spoke with Supervisor Steve Kinsey about it and Steve is poised to introduce legislation to limit vehicle size to 35'. Kinsey is also trying to get the NPS to limit the size of buses they'll accept at Muir Woods. He is further willing to include in an ordinance a prohibition on use of the following roads by tour buses - Muir Beach Overlook, Pacific Way and Seacape Drive. Paul made the following motion:
